We need your help to improve and maintain this unique resource. How often do you get a chance to do habitat restoration work in beautiful surroundings and in your own backyard! Come out and spend a few hours along the coast with great people doing great work. You will have the chance to learn about this wonderful habitat, its native plants and the amazing creatures that we are so lucky to have as neighbors, such as Belding's Savannah Sparrow, California Least Tern, Black-Necked Stilt, Pickleweed and Coast Woolly-heads.

What: Volunteers remove exotic plants, trash and debris and set out seedlings of native species. While gardening we keep our eyes open for birds, mammals, reptiles, fish and species of butterflies that visit the area.

When: 2nd Saturday of each month, 9:00 am to 12:00 noon.

Where: We meet at the WETLANDS & WILDLIFE CARE CENTER, 21900 Pacific Coast Highway (corner of PCH & Newland Street.)



Please bring hat, sunscreen, gloves, water, and wear closed toed shoes. Please join us in working on this coastal resource, improving southeast Huntington Beach and creating a legacy for future generations.
